Draft Budget Working Documents

The 2023 Draft Budget is accompanied by thirteen ‘Working Documents’, as follows:

Part I: Programme Statements of operational expenditure

Working Document I contains, pursuant to Article 41(3)(h) of the Financial Regulation, Programme Statements, which provide for each spending programme comprehensive information on the financial implementation and progress in achieving the programme objectives. This year, the Programme Statements present the status at the end of 2021 for two different multiannual financial frameworks (MFF): 2021-2017, and 2014-2020 for those programmes for which substantial payments are still being implemented.

Part II: Human Resources of the EU institutions and executive agencies

Working Document II presents information on the human resources of the EU institutions and executive agencies, and in particular for the Commission, both for the establishment plans and for external personnel and across all headings of the multiannual financial framework. Moreover, pursuant to Article 41(3)(b) of the Financial Regulation, it provides a summary table for the period 2020 – 2023 which shows the number of full-time equivalents for each category of staff and the related appropriations for all institutions and bodies referred to in Article 70 of the Financial Regulation.

Part III: Bodies set up by the European Union having legal personality

Working Document III presents detailed information relating to all decentralised agencies and Joint Undertakings, with a transparent presentation of revenue, expenditure and staff levels of various Union bodies, pursuant to Article 41(3)(c) of the Financial Regulation.

Part IV: Pilot projects and preparatory actions

Working Document IV presents information on all pilot projects and preparatory actions which have budget appropriations (commitments and/or payments) in the 2023 Draft Budget, pursuant to Article 41(3)(f) of the Financial Regulation.

Part V: Budget implementation and assigned revenue

Working Document V presents the budget implementation forecast for 2022, information on assigned revenue (implementation in 2021 and estimation for 2023) and a progress report on outstanding commitments (RAL) pursuant to Article 41(3)(d) of the Financial Regulation.

Part VI: Commission expenditure under the administrative heading of the multiannual financial framework

Working Document VI encompasses administrative expenditure to be implemented by the Commission under the administrative heading of the multiannual financial framework (heading 7) in accordance with Article 317 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, as well as the budgets of the Offices (OP, OLAF, EPSO, OIB, OIL and PMO), pursuant to Article 41(3)(e) of the Financial Regulation.

Part VII: Commission buildings

Working Document VII presents information on buildings under Section III - Commission, pursuant to Article 266(1) of the Financial Regulation.

Part VIII: Expenditure related to the external action of the European Union

Working Document VIII presents information on human resources and expenditure related to the external action of the European Union, pursuant to Article 41(10) and (11) of the Financial Regulation.

Part IX: Funding to international organisations

Working Document IX presents funding provided to international organisations, across all MFF headings, pursuant to Article 41(3)(g) of the Financial Regulation.

Part X: Financial Instruments

Working Document X presents the use made of financial instruments, pursuant to Article 41(4) of the Financial Regulation.

Part XI: Budgetary Guarantees, Common Provisioning Fund and Contingent Liabilities

Working Document XI presents the implementation of Budgetary Guarantees, the Common Provisioning Fund and the assessment of the sustainability of the contingent liabilities arising from budgetary guarantees and financial assistance pursuant to Article 41(5) of the Financial Regulation.

Part XII: EU Trust funds

Working Document XII presents the activities supported by EU Trust Funds, their implementation and performance, pursuant to Article 41(6) of the Financial Regulation.

Part XIII: Payment schedules

Working Document XIII presents summary statements of the schedule of payments due in subsequent years to meet budgetary commitments entered into in previous years, pursuant to Article 41(3)(i) of the Financial Regulation.

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1 INTRODUCTION

The Working Document Part VIII on the expenditure related to the external action of the European Union is a legal requirement under article 41(10) and (11) of the Financial Regulation¹. Its purpose is to present:

- all administrative and operational expenditure relating to the external actions of the Union, including Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) and common security and defence policy tasks, and financed from the EU budget;
- the EEAS' overall administrative expenditure for the preceding year, broken down into expenditure per Union delegation and expenditure for the central administration of the EEAS, together with operational expenditure, broken down by geographic area (regions, countries), thematic areas, Union delegations and missions.

The document is split into two sections:

- The first covers administrative expenditure relating to the external actions of the Union. It presents the current (2022) picture of human resources of the EEAS, including the Union delegations, EEAS implementation in 2021 and Draft Budget proposals for 2023.
- The second section presents operational expenditure in 2021, the Budget 2022 and Draft Budget for 2023. This concerns the 2021-2027 MFF Heading 6 - Neighbourhood and the World, including specific details for the planning and implementation of Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) civilian missions financed by the EU Budget.

2.3 Draft Budget 2023 request - External action administrative resources (including administrative expenditure)

Now in its second decade of existence, the EEAS has come a long way. It is recognised as a solid and reliable international partner and has increased the coherence, effectiveness and visibility of the EU's external action.

It pursues its core activities of managing diplomatic relations and strategic partnerships with non-EU countries in close collaboration with the national diplomatic services of EU countries, the UN and other leading powers. It also actively contributes to a wide and increasing number of files, notably security under the Common Security and Defence Policy, climate change, mediation, peace building, development and humanitarian aid, and human rights issues.

The EEAS baseline Draft Budget for 2023 - the amounts needed to keep the institution running as-is while covering the increases arising from statutory and contractual obligations - amounts to EUR 823.0 million, which represents an increase of EUR 45.3 million (+5.8 %) compared to the 2022 Budget.

This increase is mainly explained by statutory obligations such as the salary adjustment and exceptional expenses due to delays in moving to the new EEAS building, as well as the pilot project for the European Diplomatic Academy.

To this baseline budget comes additional reinforcements to cover needs caused by factors outside of the EEAS' control or additional tasks with which the EEAS has been charged by the legislator. These reinforcements are justified by the EEAS new obligations related to the Strategic Compass, plus the creation of crisis management capabilities.

Globally, the 2023 Draft Budget, including the additional amounts, is calculated at EUR 825.6 million, which represents an increase by EUR 47.9 million (+6.2 %) and 23 net full-time equivalents compared to the 2022 Budget.

A number of ongoing discussions have not yet reached sufficient maturity to justify the inclusion of the corresponding resources in the 2023 Draft Budget. These open points, notably related to the opening of a delegation in Oman, an upgrade of the presence point in The Hague, and the transfer of the technical dialogue support tasks from EULEX Kosovo to the EU Office may be part of an Amending Letter or Amending Budget at a later stage.

2.3.3 Requested evolution in establishment plan posts at Headquarters and in Delegations

For 2023, the EEAS proposes notably to:

- 4 specialised co-financed national expert posts are strengthening the EUMS for PESCO, info management, G5 Sahel coordination and cyber defence, and 1 cost-shared expert is reinforcing the EU INTCEN in the crisis management package;
- Moreover, the inclusion of 20 contract agents: 16 as part of the crisis management package, 3 within the Strategic Compass, and the transfer of 1 Regional IT Officer (RITO) from DG INTPA;
- In parallel, there is a reduction of 2 FTE ‘*intérimaires*’;
- The EEAS adapts the establishment plan to allow for promotions strictly in line with the statutory rates set out at Annex I-B to the Staff Regulations, which the institutions are legally bound to respect;
- It also transfers 2 officials (1 AD and 1 AST/SC) to the delegations, and converts 2 AST into AD.

3.2 Operational appropriations requested for 2023 for MFF Heading 6 – Neighbourhood and the World

Given the delays in the adoption of the legal bases in this heading, 2022 will represent the first full year of operation of most EU instruments outside of the EU's borders. Policy priorities will inevitably be tied to the COVID-19 ripple effect throughout the world. The focus will be to support partner countries in their continuing public health efforts (including vaccination) as well as with their economic recovery. In addition, the Russian aggression against Ukraine, if protracted, is expected to trigger instability through increasing food and commodities prices that are feared to affect the poorest and most import dependent countries. The external focus will therefore be on the Union's assistance to Ukraine, its displaced residents and the countries affected by refugee flows, as well as support to partner countries in tackling the challenges of their economic recovery post COVID-19.

Moreover, the EU will need to continue tackling the ongoing crises such as in Syria and other continuing challenges such as the development and reform agenda, conflicts, the negative effects of climate change and the global threat of famine. The EU will continue to support and promote democracy, the rule of law and the rules based multilateral global system while tackling specific emerging challenges such as disinformation. Migration remains a key priority, encompassing the root causes to irregular migration and forced displacement, the protection of the most vulnerable fleeing conflict, as well as assisting third countries in strengthening border security and dismantling criminal organisations trafficking human beings. The last actions adopted by the four EU Trust Funds were contracted by end 2021. From 2022 onwards, continuing activities previously channelled through the Trust Funds will be largely programmed and implemented through NDICI- Global Europe under the EU budget.

In the Draft Budget 2023, the proposal for expenditure related to external action of the EU (in Heading 6) sees a decrease in commitment appropriations by 2,3 % to EUR 16 782 million, in line with the Multiannual Financial Framework. The Commission proposes to increase payment appropriations by 6,6 % to EUR 13 774 million.

The figures in the table below are C1 (voted) appropriations and include the support expenditure (so-called former BA lines appropriations). 3.3 Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) 2021-2023

The assistance financed by the EU Budget and channelled through Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP) civilian operations contributes to the preservation of peace, the prevention of conflicts, and strengthening international security. In 2023 the CFSP will continue supporting the preservation of peace and stability through the Common Defence and Security Policy (CSDP) missions, notably EULEX Kosovo, EUMM Georgia and other missions across the world, as well as the nine EU Special Representatives (EUSR). It will continue to support actions in the field of non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction and small arms and light weapons.

The tables below show the 2021, 2022 and 2023 budgetary evolution for CFSP civilian operations, including a more detailed level of planning by CSDP mission. The figures in the first table below relate to the voted budget appropriations for 2022 and do not include 2022 transfers or reinforcements from assigned revenues stemming from recoveries.
