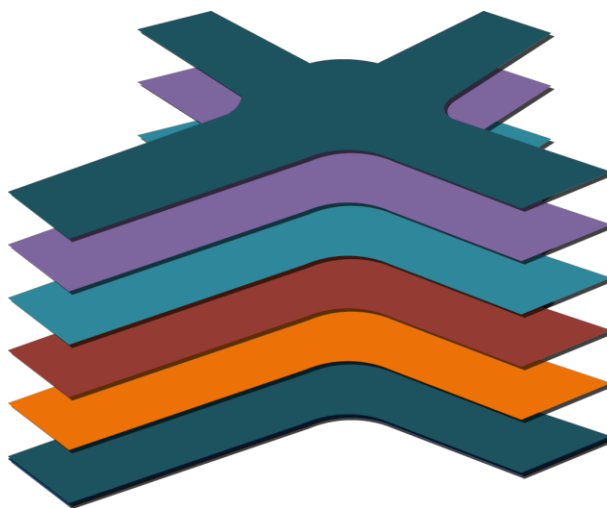

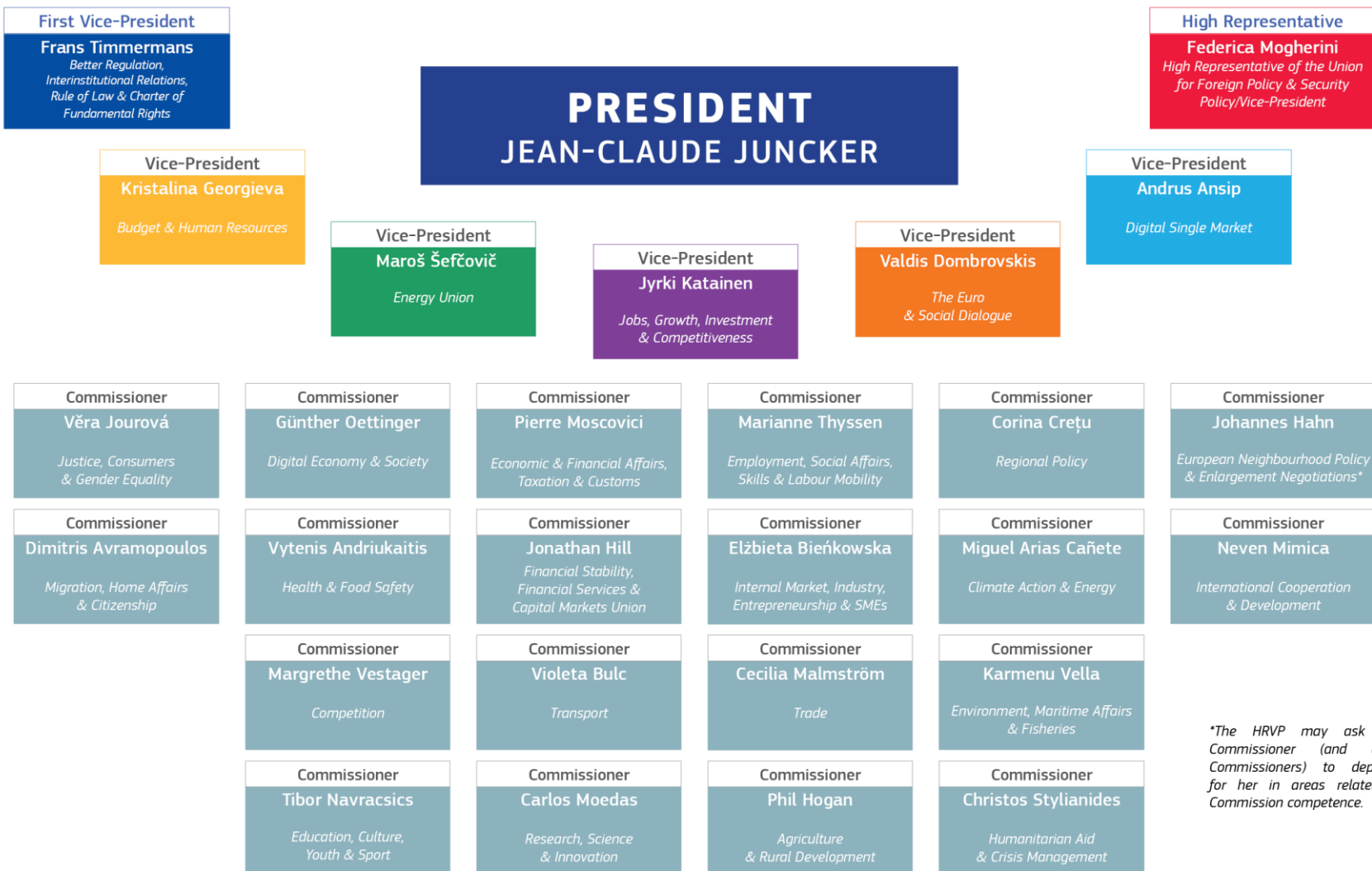

Exchanged with national Parliaments 200 times



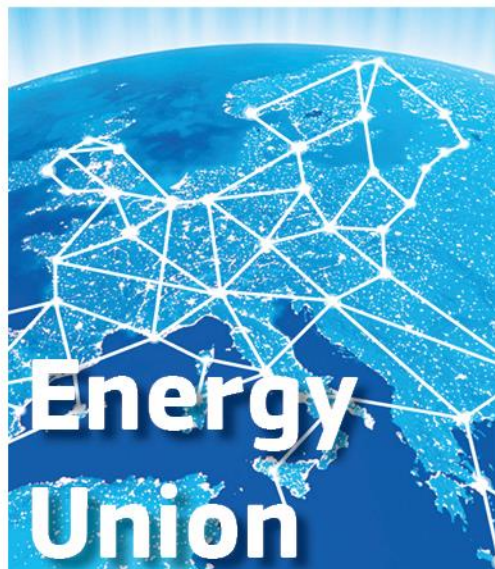
Addressed the European Parliament plenary 58 times

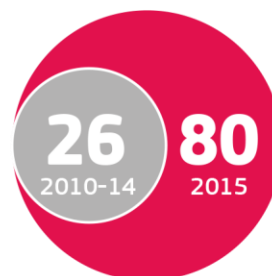
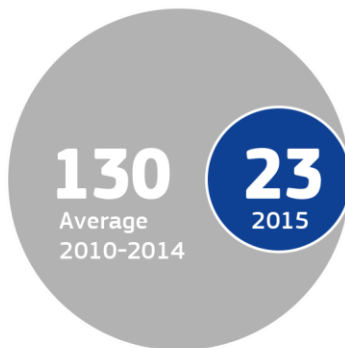

THE EUROPEAN STABILITY MECHANISM PROGRAMME

President Juncker steered negotiations at political level

Vice-President Dombrovskis and Commissioner Moscovici represented Commission at **20 Eurogroups** (of which **11 special meetings on Greece**) and **3 ECB Governing Councils**

- ➔ A new start for **jobs and growth** in Greece
 - Frontloading **€35 billion** for investment projects
- ➔ **Social fairness**
 - For first time, social impact assessment of new programme
- ➔ Tackling **vested interests**
 - Modernisation of Greek administration
 - Ensuring fiscal consolidation
- ➔ Creation of **Structural Reform Support Service** within the Commission

ADDRESSING THE REFUGEE CRISIS



The Commission presented an EU Agenda for Migration with a **comprehensive approach** to one of the biggest challenges facing the EU

Agreement reached in record time among Member States on **resettlement of 22,000 people** from outside the EU and **relocation of 160,000 people** within the EU



EU budget **mobilising almost €10 billion** in 2015 and 2016 to support Member States

Tripled our presence at sea, rescuing countless more lives



Dispatched experts to hotspots in **Greece and Italy** to help register and fingerprint arrivals

Redoubled efforts to tackle **smugglers** and dismantle **human trafficker groups**



Joint Action Plan **Turkey**; to help stem the flow of migrants and refugees

17-point Action plan for **Western Balkans** including **100,000 new reception places**



Increased humanitarian aid, **EU Trust Funds for Syria and Africa**

10 PRIORITIES

THE INVESTMENT PLAN FOR EUROPE



- European Parliament and Council approved in record time
- Already financed a swathe of projects in sectors such as renewable energy, high-speed broadband, healthcare and R&D
- Provided loans to start-ups and SMEs
- Set up advisory services to help companies bring their ideas to life
- Begun work on removing barriers to investment and deepening the single market
- Increased financing to the Youth Employment Initiative in February 2015
- Recommendation to help Europe's 12 million long-term unemployed get back to work in September 2015

A DIGITAL SINGLE MARKET FOR EUROPE



- 16 initiatives to be delivered by the end of next year
- First achievements in 2015:
 - End of roaming charges by June 2017 and new EU-wide net neutrality rules
 - Allowing consumers to travel with their online legal content across the EU
 - Ensuring a better protection to consumers when they buy online
- Leading the digital revolution:
 - Key agreements signed to develop the next generation of communication networks (5G) with Japan and China

ENERGY UNION AND CLIMATE CHANGE POLICY



- Framework Strategy for Energy Union and forward looking Climate Change policy proposed in February 2015
- Improving connections in Iberian Peninsula and the Baltics
- The EU is on track and made a clear pledge back in March: a binding, economy-wide emissions reduction target of at least 40% by 2030, compared to 1990 levels. This is the most ambitious contribution presented to date.

- Action Plan for fair and efficient corporate taxation
- Action Plan on Capital Markets Union
- Steering political agreement on automatic exchange of tax rulings

10 PRIORITIES

COMPLETING THE ECONOMIC AND MONETARY UNION

- The Five Presidents' Report outlining how the Economic and Monetary Union should be strengthened
- A package of measures setting out the work ahead to build a deeper and fairer Economic and Monetary Union

THE TRANSATLANTIC TRADE AND INVESTMENT PARTNERSHIP

- Sustained pace of negotiations: 11th round successfully concluded last week (5 rounds under the Juncker Commission)
- Increased transparency and publication of key TTIP documents, setting new standards for openness in future international trade agreements
- Proposal to create an Investment Court System: a modern and transparent system for resolving investment disputes

SECURITY AND JUSTICE

- Adoption of European Agenda on Security 2015-2020 for better cooperation against terrorism, organised crime and cybercrime
- New Europol unit to combat terrorist propaganda

A STRONGER GLOBAL ACTOR

- EU brokers Iran nuclear deal
- Widespread political and financial support to Ukraine
- Key interlocutor for Serbia-Kosovo dialogue and FYROM

BETTER REGULATION AND TRANSPARENCY

- 45 Citizens' Dialogues
- Better Regulation and launch of REFIT exercise
- Increased openness about meetings
