Karmenu Vella was born in Zurrieq, Malta in June 1950. He graduated in Architecture and Civil Engineering from the University of Malta, and later obtained a Master of Science in Tourism Management from the University of Sheffield.

Mr Vella served and contributed to the Maltese democratic process for over four decades. He was first elected to Parliament in 1976 and continued to be re-elected in the elections that followed, for nine consecutive times. During his political career he has been appointed Minister for Public Works, Minister for Industry and Trade, and Minister for Tourism twice. Karmenu Vella vacated his parliamentary seat in 2014, following his nomination as European Commissioner. Mr Vella was awarded the National Order of Merit from the Republic of Malta in 2019.

During his term as European Commissioner, Karmenu Vella was a key actor for the realisation of the institution's ambitious and comprehensive plans in the areas of environment and ocean protection. His work acknowledged by the World Economic Forum and the Forum of Young Global Leaders, who during his term in office awarded the European Commission with the 2019 Circular Economy prize. Karmenu Vella's work towards the protection and sustainable use of the oceans has also been acknowledged by the GEOMAR Helmholtz Centre for Ocean Research, who under the patronage of the Prime Minister of Schleswig-Holstein awarded him with the German Ocean Award. His merits in the aforementioned field were also commended by a number of high-ranking personalities including former US Secretary of State John Kerry, Prince Albert II of Monaco, the German Federal Minister of the Environment Svenja Schulze and the Deputy Director of UNESCO, Vladimir Ryabinin. Mr Vella was also awarded the Medal of the French Maritime Cluster in 2018, as a recognition of his achievements and dedication in the maritime field.

During his professional career, Karmenu Vella has held a number of managerial and directorship posts. In 1973 he started his own private practice as an Architect and Civil Engineer, and during that same year he was appointed a director until 1976 on Mid Med Bank - Malta. In 1974 he joined the Libyan Maltese Holding Company as Managing Director where he was responsible to setup and subsequently manage the company. The Libyan Maltese Holding Company is a joint venture between the Maltese and Libyan Government. Under his leadership, the company managed to set up a number of manufacturing and servicing companies in Malta focusing to provide necessary provisions to the Libyan market. In 2001 he was appointed executive chairman of Corinthia Hotels International till 2007 and then executive chairman of Corinthia's Mediterranean Construction Co Ltd., up to 2010. In 2010 he joined Betfair Group Ltd. as a director and sat on SMS-Mondial Travel Group's Board as chairman until 2013.
