
How to organize a body like the RSB?

- Challenge: Several legitimate, but competing concerns --> balance?
- How much independence?
 - Concerns that speak in favor: Legitimacy, impartiality, credibility, and commitment
 - But (I): Independence from what? New types of dependencies?
 - Relevant concern for the RSB?
 - But (II): More than post-hoc control? Also control of policy in-the-making?
 - Would a national government let an independent actor monitor its making of policy?
- So: A balance needs to be found

How much power should the RSB have?

- Power veto rights?
- Does this matter?
- Should veto rights be ultimate?
 - Should technical experts be allowed to stop the political process?
- So, again: A balance needs to be found

Does veto power matter?
