## Subject: Petition calling on the European Commission to stop the long distance transport of live animals

Commissioner Andriukaitis asked me to thank you for presenting a petition<sup>1</sup> calling to stop the long distance transport of live animals and to respond on his behalf.

I am fully aware that long distance transport raises legitimate animal welfare concerns: the longer the transport the higher the risks for the welfare of animals. This is why Council Regulation (EC) No 1/2005 on the protection of animals during transport<sup>2</sup> contains additional provisions for these journeys.<sup>3</sup>

Animal welfare during transport is a complex multidimensional issue which cannot be solved by simply imposing a limit on transport time. As already indicated by the relevant Commission report of 2011<sup>4</sup>, efforts should indeed focus on the enforcement of the existing legislation.

I would like to inform you that the Commission has no plans to stop the long distance transport of live animals in the near future and is investing more efforts to assist Member States in the process of enforcement of the EU legislation through various actions.

The most recent action being taken by the Commission in this regard is the establishment of the EU Platform on Animal Welfare<sup>5</sup> that brings together Member States and stakeholders from different backgrounds to enhance dialogue on animal welfare issues. To this purpose, a subgroup on animal transport will be proposed within the context of the EU Platform on Animal Welfare at the next meeting in November this year. This will
