







90% of Asylum applications in the EU were lodged in only 10 Member States





#### **IMMEDIATE ACTIONS**

RELOCATION / ASSISTANCE



- A proposal for a permanent EU system on relocation in emergency situations
- . A commitment to relocate 160 000 people from Greece, Italy and the most affected Member States
- On the front line, staff from EU agencies deployed to identify, register and fingerprint incoming migrants, speed up the processing of asylum seekers and coordinate the return of irregular migrants.



 On the financial front, the Commission has already mobilised an additional €700 million in emergency funding


#### 11 IDENTIFIED 'HOTSPOTS': SIX IN ITALY AND FIVE IN GREECE (12/10/2015)

#### IMPLEMENTING EXISTING EU LAW



The EU has a Common European Asylum System. It is a strong set of common rules on asylum and irregular migration that has to be applied.

#### Progress made

#### Next steps

40 new infringement decisions against 19 Member States, on top of 34 cases already open.

Member States to fully implement the Common European Asylum System.

The Commission continues to pursue infringement procedures swiftly and effectively.

Ongoing work with Greece to reinstate Greek Dublin transfers by the end of 2015.

Schengen: Commission Opinion on the prolongation of temporary border controls by Germany, Austria and Slovenia.



## SUPPORT FOR THIRD COUNTRIES



- 22,504 displaced people will be resettled from third countries into the EU
- Ensuring full application of EU legislation on migration and asylum
- To all Member States Asylum, Migration and Integration Fund with a budget of €7 billion for 2014-20
- To third countries €96,8 billion for external cooperation assistance for 2014-20





EU COOPERATION WITH TURKEY

Joint Action Plan for the EU and Turkey agreed Ensuring refugees who are in Turkey stay in Turkey Preventing refugees and migrants from travelling through Turkey to the EU

Overall package endorsed by the European Council





### Leaders' Meeting WESTERN BALKANS ROUTE

Sunday, 25 October 2015

#### Actions in three main areas

- Providing shelter to the refugees in need through the promise of 100,000 reception places, of which 50,000 in Greece;
- managing the migration flows together
- better border management at internal and external EU borders

#### Operational measures

- Croatia activated the EU Civil Protection

  Mechanism to help them in their efforts to
  provide temporary shelter, rest, food, health,
  water and sanitation to all in need.
- Leaders appointed contact points who will communicate on a weekly basis.



"When we talk about migration we are talking about people. [...] We are talking about people who have had to flee from war in Syria, the ISIS terror in Libya and dictatorship in Eritrea. And what worries me is to see the resentment, the rejection, the fear directed against these people by some parts of the population. [...] What worries me is to hear politicians from left to right nourishing a populism that brings only anger and not solutions. 




