The Council takes note of the Court's observations on the risks related to the participation of the Executive Agency to the implementation of a new budgetary, accounting, and financial system, SUMMA, as a pilot for the development of the system for the Commission. The Council, therefore, invites the Executive Agency to liaise with the Commission in order to receive support by means of adequate and urgent solutions, to address the weaknesses of the system, as demanded by the Court and the Executive Agency itself.

The Council is concerned about the Court's observation on the persistence of a high level of operational appropriations carried-over under one title, of 61.8 % in 2022 and 54.3 % in 2021, in spite of the observation made by the Court in the previous year. The Council calls on the Executive Agency to implement measures to mitigate the structural issues in its budget planning and implementation, in compliance with the budgetary principle of annuality.
