

Massimo Bordignon

Professor of Public Economics at the Catholic University of Milan, where he also acted as Chair of the Department of Economics and Finance and of the Graduate School in Economics. Previously, he taught at Birmingham University, University of Bergamo, Brescia, and Venice and lectured at Uppsala University, Munich University, Chengdu University and at the College of Europe. He was also President of the Italian Society of Public Economists, member of the Scientific Board of IFO and of the managing board of the International Institute of Public Finance. Massimo Bordignon worked as a consultant for several regional, national, and international institutions, in particular the Fiscal Affairs Department of the International Monetary Fund and the Italian Treasury. He studied Philosophy at the University of Florence and moved to the UK for his post graduate studies in Economics, gaining a MA from Essex and a PhD from Warwick University
