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1. MISSION STATEMENT

The task of the Publications Office is to provide direct and free-of-charge access to European law and all publications of the European Union, as well as to publish, on all media and in all formats, the publications of the institutions and other bodies of the European Union under optimum technical and financial conditions.

2. THIS YEAR'S CHALLENGES

Since 1 July 2013 the electronic online edition of the *Official Journal of the European Union* is authentic and produces legal effects. This milestone represents the visible "tip of the iceberg" of the profound digital revolution that took place in the Office during the last 5 years.

The Publications Office achieved a major IT architecture transformation programme in 2012 and a deep re-organisation aimed at adapting its structure and working methods to state-of-the-art IT technologies in 2013. Thus the Office has further consolidated its position as a centre of excellence in publishing, providing easy access and promoting re-use of EU law and other types of documents from EU institutions and bodies. These changes are beneficial to its direct customers, the so-called author services and content providers. Benefits also reach European citizens at large, through increased transparency and accountability of the European institutions.

Moreover, the Office aims at contributing to societal and macroeconomic objectives: re-use activities are expected to impact on innovation, growth and jobs through the creation of new services based on EU public information.

Not only the Office has been upgrading and modernising its "traditional" services; more and more it has been asked to manage and deliver new services, such as the Open Data Portal, metadata normalisation, JURE database (case law), summaries of legislation, Commission services' guide, repository and access to studies.

A special effort is being conducted in the domain of legislative consolidation, as part of the initiative REFIT – Regulatory fitness and performance. Also the ongoing implementation of the European Legislation Identifier (ELI) by the Office aims at improving access and re-usability of legislation, by linking EU and national provisions.

It is remarkable that most of these new services have been initiated or taken over without the transfer of additional resources and within the constraints of the staff reduction plan of the European Commission.

The main challenges ahead in 2014 are the following:

- Continuing to ensure the smooth production and online publication of the **Official Journal**, taking into account the changes of production providers;
- Achieving the loading of **Cellar as single repository for legal information** (content and metadata) published by the Office;
- Releasing the **first version of the Publications Office's portal**, as a single access point for content currently available through the different websites managed by the Office;
- Increasing the production, quality monitoring, dissemination as well as re-usability of content of e-books through the **EU Bookshop** and other means;
- Continuing to work on the **Open Data Portal**, by increasing quantity and quality of data sets from Commission services, as well as from the other EU institutions, agencies and bodies;
- Designing and implementing new electronic standard forms in an innovative and intuitive way to meet the requirements of the new **public procurement** legislative package;
- Pursuing the efforts in providing harmonised and standardised metadata, as well as common authority tables to ensure interoperability and enhanced access, search, linking and re-use of content through **semantic technologies**;
- Ensure the online publication and smooth production of the **Summaries of EU legislation**, taking into account the integration in the new EUR-Lex portal;
- Further improving effectiveness by closing the publications' stock and distribution centre in Gasperich and outsourcing the related service provision.

Description

The Publications Office has a quality control service which ensures that the texts published in the Official Journal respect the rules laid down in the Inter-institutional Style Guide and/or are in line with the requirements of the Author services.

Justification

The role of the Publications Office in publishing the Official Journal of the European Union and guaranteeing its authenticity is laid down in Decision 2009/496/EC, Euratom of 26 June 2009 on the organisation and operation of the Publications Office of the European Union [see article 3, paragraph 1 (a)] (OJ L 168, 30.6.2009, p. 41), amended by Decision 2012/368/EU, Euratom of 29 June 2012 (OJ L 179, 11.7.2012, p. 15).

Publication of the Official Journal is specifically mentioned in the Treaty on European Union (Articles 110, 248 and 254), Council Decision of 15 September 1958 creating the Official Journal of the European Communities (OJ 17, 6.10.1958, p. 390) and Parliament and Council Regulation (EC) No 1049/2001 of 30 May 2001 on public access to European Parliament, Council and Commission documents (OJ L 145, 31.5.2001, p. 43), and in Consolidated versions of the Treaty on European Union and the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union (OJ C 115, 9.5.2008, p. 1).

Ongoing consolidation was decided by the European Council of Edinburgh, 1992, which emphasised that consolidation is one of the main channels of making legislation "more readily accessible in a concise and intelligible form".

The directives on public procurement, which determine the notices to be published and the manner in which they are published for the public contracting authorities/entities (national or regional entities and institutions), make it mandatory above specific thresholds to publish these notices in the Supplement to the Official Journal.
