Purpose: The purpose of the contract is provision of an updated version of the <u>General Terms</u> and <u>Conditions for Information Technology Contracts</u> (the GTC) used by the European Commission. The selected law firm will undertake a legal analysis of existing contractual documents and make proposal for a revised version of the GTCs. All services and documents under the contract will be provided in English.

Access to market: Participation in the procurement procedure will be open on equal terms to all natural and legal persons coming within the scope of the Treaties, as well as to international organisations. - capacity to perform the contract with an experienced team of at least three lawyers with knowledge in English at least at C1 level¹, with adequate educational background (degree at least at level of Master of Laws) and expertise relevant to the tasks that they shall perform as follows:
 - ✓ at least 1 senior lawyer, having at least 5 years of relevant professional experience practice in the area of ICT law after being registered as fully qualified lawyer with one of the Belgian Bar Associations;
 - ✓ at least 1 lawyer, having at least 3 years of relevant professional experience practice in the area of ICT law after being registered as fully qualified lawyer with one of the Belgian Bar Associations;
 - ✓ at least 1 junior lawyer, having at least 2 years of relevant professional experience practice in the area of ICT law after obtaining educational degree of Master of Laws.
- Candidates must prove experience in the field of drafting contractual documents in the field of ICT law (at least three projects/references having similar or higher/greater value, scope and complexity, completed in the last three years preceding the tender submission deadline).
