What is the Commission Work Programme?

Every year, the European Commission adopts a Work Programme which sets out its key initiatives for the year ahead. It informs citizens how we will deliver on our political priorities and turn them into concrete action.

Timeline of the 2024 Work Programme



11 July 2023: Executive Vice-President Šefčovič meets the European Parliament's Conference of Committee Chairs to discuss legislative programming for the year ahead.



08 September 2023: President von der Leyen meets the European Parliament's Conference of Presidents to discuss priorities for the State of the Union speech and the 2024 Commission Work Programme.



13 September 2023: The President of the European Commission delivers her <u>State of the Union address</u> to the European Parliament, setting out her political priorities for the year ahead.

The President and Executive Vice-President for the Green Deal, Interinstitutional Relations and Foresight send a <u>Letter of Intent</u> to the President of the European Parliament and the Council of the EU Presidency, outlining the specific measures the Commission intends to take following the President's speech. The letter kick-starts a dialogue with the Parliament and Council.



17 October 2023: The Commission adopts its Work Programme for 2024, and presents it afterwards in the European Parliament and to the other institutional partners.



15 November 2023: Presentation of the Work Programme at the first General Affairs Council (GAC) following the adoption.
