I. Challenges and expectations for the NGEU/RRF audit

NGEU: biggest European recovery plan since 1957

- RRF: an innovative financing model
- RRF performance based, not cost-based
- Milestones (reforms) and targets (investments but not only)



- Challenges/risks to overcome
 - 1.Existence and readiness of appropriate management and control systems in Member States
 - 2. Absorption capacity (frontloading commitments)
 - 3.Operational functioning of management and control systems
 - 4.External audit capacity: avoiding « dead angles » (role of MS Supreme Audit Institutions, role of European Court of Auditors and need for cooperation/coordination)



5. Evaluation of RRF:

 Possibility to measure results of the RRF as a whole?

Mid-term and final evaluations foreseen but what methodology?

- Structural reforms or budget support ?
- Windfall effect or justified investments?
- Sustainability of reforms ?

Last but not least : changes in macroeconomic framework



II. Mainstreaming: the inclusion (and performance tracking) of horizontal priorities and cross-cutting policy areas in the budgeting of EU programmes

- Increasing importance under the new MFF (as well as under the NGEU/RRF: 37 % allocated to climate action, 20 % to digital transition)
- EU's horizontal policy priorities: Climate, biodiversity, gender, sustainable development goals (SDGs) and other objectives such as digital transition, migration, clean air and COVID-19.
- Difficulties to measure and implement cross-cutting themes in practice
- Is there an appropriate performance tracking framework in place to measure the EU contribution to the horizontal priorities?
- Next ECA report on the performance of the budget to be published in quarter 4 of 2022
