Commissioner

Virginijus Sinkevičius is the present Commissioner for the Environment, Oceans and Fisheries, at the European Commission. Mr Sinkevičius was from 2017 to 2019 Minister of Economy, and before he was leading the Committee of Economy at the Parliament of Lithuania. Mr. Sinkevičius was elected to the Parliament in October 2016. Prior, he was a Team Lead for Regulatory Affairs at Invest Lithuania. Mr. Sinkevičius holds BA in International Relations and Affairs from Aberystwyth University and Master's degree in European International Affairs from Maastricht University.

Rüdiger Strempel HELCOM Executive Secretary

An international lawyer by training, Rüdiger Strempel looks back on many years of experience of environmental law, policy, and diplomacy at the national and international levels, with a particular focus on international marine conservation.

Among his previous appointments are the positions of Executive Secretary of the Agreement on the Conservation of Small Cetaceans of the Baltic, North East Atlantic, Irish and North Seas (UNEP/ASCOBANS) and of the Common Wadden Sea Secretariat (CWSS). He has also worked as a consultant for a number of United Nations agencies, including the United Nations Volunteers (UNV) programme and the Secretariat of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC).

Moreover, Rüdiger has a background as a journalist and professional communicator and he is the author or co-author of numerous articles and several books.

In addition to his work as Executive Secretary of ASCOBANS, his specific Baltic credentials include chairing the ASCOBANS Baltic Sea Steering Group ("Jastarnia Group") from 2009 to 2017 and his membership in the Advisory Board of the Baltic Centre of Excellence for Development, Education and Research (BALTDER), University of Gdańsk, Poland from 2003 to 2005.

A German national, Rüdiger studied at the University of Bonn, Germany and obtained the First and Second German State Examinations in law in 1991 and 1995 respectively.

Currently, Kaj's work in various projects focuses on co-design, communication and advocacy related to nutrient recycling, river basin management, carbon farming as well as policy and market incentives for regenerative agriculture, carbon sequestration and other ecosystem services.



Žymantas Morkvėnas Baltic Environmental Forum

Z. Morkvenas is acting director and biodiversity expert at the NGO Baltic environmental forum. His thematic focus is practical nature conservation in open landscapes, agricultural practice impact to biodiversity, development of socio-economic mechanisms of maintaining biodiversity in rural landscapes.

Z. Morkvenas was leading the team to create new agri-environmental measure to support maintenance of alluvial grasslands and fen mires for conservation of globally threatened aquatic warbler. The measure is successfully running in current financial period and has been nominated as good practice example in several publications. He has been involved in a research on the outcome-based agri-environmental measures. Z. Morkvenas is a thematic expert on biodiversity in various European networks.

Z. Morkvenas has long years experience on various conservation projects, in particular addressing aspects of wetland habitat restoration, nature communication, promoting small scale nature friendly farming, promoting short food supply chains, fostering natural and cultural heritage in the context of rural development. Currently, major work focus of Z. Morkvenas is practical conservation of rarest Europe's passerine bird Aquatic warbler and promoting biodiversity conservation at farmland areas.

Besides being director and senior biodiversity expert at Baltic environmental forum, Z. Morkvenas is also a lecturer at Vilnius University teaching environmental communication and conservation biology.

On a private basis, Z. Morkvenas is also a farmer acting in small 20 ha farm with extensive cattle grazing and management of wetland habitat. Z. Morkvenas is chairman of the board at association of small-scale farmers called "VivaSol".

Hans Bruyninckx is the Executive Director of the European Environment Agency since 1 June, 2013. In 1996 Dr Bruyninckx completed a PhD in international environmental politics at Colorado State University.

For her work Angela has received the European Commissions' award 'Woman of the Year in the Blue Economy 2016'.
