

Explaining the *Commission work programme 2026*

What is the Commission work programme?

Every year, the Commission adopts its annual work programme setting out the list of the most important new policy and legislative initiatives it will take in the year ahead. The work programme is a key vehicle to deliver on commitments outlined in the [Political Guidelines](#) and the [mission letters](#) sent by President von der Leyen to each College Member and the ideas set out in the [2025 State of the Union address](#).

This Commission work programme marks the EU's independence moment. The central goal is simplification to drive both increased competitiveness and the full realisation of the Single Market. In addition to boosting economic strength, this programme directly addresses the needs of citizens by prioritising affordability and safeguarding jobs in Europe, particularly in manufacturing and clean energy. Furthermore, the document reaffirms the EU's commitment to fundamental values, reinforcing strong democratic principles while strategically ensuring security and defence.

Simplification as a central focus

A significant share of next year's initiatives focuses on making EU law simpler, clearer, and easier to implement. Omnibus and other simplification proposals will simplify rules across key sectors, including energy product legislation, taxation, defence, competitiveness, and innovation.

The Commission has already put forward omnibus and other simplification proposals aiming to bring more than EUR 8.6 billion in annual savings for European businesses.

In addition to the current momentum:

- Several omnibus and major simplification proposals will still be brought forward in 2025, in key areas such as digital, environment, automotive, food and feed safety, and medical devices.
- More than half of the work programme legislative proposals in 2026 will have a strong simplification component, including the omnibus proposals on energy product legislation, taxation, and for citizens.
- We will continue to stress test our laws and implementing rules and use our new consultation tools—implementation dialogues and reality checks—to find further opportunities for simplification, which will then feed into additional simplification proposals.
