

# PRIVACY STATEMENT

## DG Justice Newsletter Combating antisemitism and fostering Jewish life

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data, the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to the processing operation “Management of subscriptions to receive information”, undertaken by the services of the European Commission, is presented below.

### **1. SERVICE DESCRIPTION**

---

The DG JUSTICE Newsletter on Combating antisemitism and fostering Jewish life is produced 15 times per year to inform the general public about the developments related to prevention and combating antisemitism and fostering Jewish life in EU, including messages from Commission’s officials, statements, funding opportunities, new studies, legislation, reports, events, good practices, policy developments, etc. via email.

### **2. HOW, WHY, AND FOR HOW LONG DO WE COLLECT AND PROCESS YOUR PERSONAL DATA?**

---

**How to subscribe:** You can subscribe on a dedicated subscription page or write a request for subscription to [EC-COORDINATOR-ANTISEMITISM@ec.europa.eu](mailto:EC-COORDINATOR-ANTISEMITISM@ec.europa.eu) in order to receive the DG Justice Newsletter. All personal data is stored in the EU Newsroom application. EU Newsroom is a news management system developed by the European Commission.

**Why we collect data:** In order to carry out this processing operation, the controller collects the e-mail address, which is needed to ensure the delivery of the service to the subscriber, as the Newsletter is sent by e-mail. Optional personal data (Title, Last Name, First Name, Function, Country of residence, Sector of activity/interest, Profession) is useful to the Commission for statistical purposes and for better targeting the content of the Newsletter.

No personal data is transferred to other systems at any moment, exported from the newsletter or otherwise further treated. Your personal data will not be used for an automated decision-making including profiling.

**What legal grounds:** The Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 23 October 2018 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data, is applicable.

As you have subscribed to this Newsletter, you have given your consent to the processing of your personal data and the processing is therefore lawful under Article 5.1(c) of the Regulation.

**How long:** The EU Newsroom keeps only the current data in order to deliver by e-mail the Newsletter, until you unsubscribe from the mailing list. No history is saved. Each change of your subscription erases instantly previous data; this includes also cancelling your subscription(s). Personal data will be retained for a period of three years after the newsletter services you have subscribed to have ceased to operate, and will then be permanently removed. If you unsubscribe, your personal data is permanently deleted. If you modify your email, no history or previous versions are kept.

**Who has access:** Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the 'need to know' principle. Such staff abide by statutory confidentiality agreements. The information we collect will not be given to any third party, except to the extent and for the purpose we may be required to do so by law.

### **3. HOW DO WE PROTECT AND SAFEGUARD YOUR PERSONAL DATA?**

---

The EU Newsroom is developed, maintained and managed by the European Commission. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to the [Commission Decision \(EU, Euratom\) 2017/46](#) of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission. All information related to the content and users of EU Newsroom is stored in databases on the servers (all located on the EU territory) in the European Commission Data Centre (run by DIGIT), the operations of which abide by the Commission's security decisions and provisions established by the Directorate of Security for this kind of servers and services.

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

The relevant processing operations are under the responsibility of the Head of the Unit C2 Fundamental Rights policy (JUST C2), Directorate-General Justice and Consumers, acting as the Controller.

### **4. HOW CAN YOU VERIFY, MODIFY OR DELETE YOUR INFORMATION?**

---

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to

restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You can verify which personal data is stored on your behalf, have it modified, respectively corrected or deleted, by contacting this functional mailbox: [EC-COORDINATOR-ANTISEMITISM@ec.europa.eu](mailto:EC-COORDINATOR-ANTISEMITISM@ec.europa.eu).

You can also withdraw your consent to receive the newsletter at any point by using the link included in the footer, at the bottom of each newsletter we send you.

Appropriate action shall be taken within a week of receiving the request.
