Measure 4.2.4 Extension of the protocol on legal education in schools, at university level included

On 11 November 2022, a cooperation protocol on legal education was signed with the Ministry of Justice, the Ministry of Education, the Superior Council of Magistracy, the High Court of Cassation and Justice and the National Union of Bar Associations, with the aim of promoting legal education in schools.

During 2025, several legal education activities were carried out in schools and universities, including a competition held in November-December on the theme "What would I tell you about drugs if you were my brother/sister?".

Measure 4.8.4 Developing/strengthening partnerships with non-governmental organisations/the private sector active in the field of environmental protection (GENVAL 10.1.2. 2. Member States are encouraged to develop effective instruments for cooperation with NGOs to improve the resolution of environmental-related complaints, such as those established between the Romanian authorities and Greenpeace

The Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice has taken steps to expand its cooperation with NGOs/the private sector, particularly in the area of forestry offences.

Separately, cooperation with other entities active in the field of environmental protection, even if not formalised in the form of protocols, remains active at least through the specialised structure, namely the Office for Combating Environmental Offences within the Prosecutor's Office attached to the High Court of Cassation and Justice.

Measure 5.3.3. Strengthening the capacity of law enforcement agencies to identify situations where organised crime groups benefit from the support of officials

On 14 May 2024, the financing contract for project IS31A 001 - "**Better prepared, more CAPABLE in the fight against corruption!**" was signed, financed by the 2021-2027 National Internal Security Programme.

The project is being implemented by the Public Ministry, the Anti-Corruption General Directorate [ro.: DGA] and the General Inspectorate of Security Forces of the Czech Republic, over a period of 12 months.

The overall objective of the project is to strengthen the operational capacity of partner structures in the fight against crime by increasing and improving the level of training of their specialists in combating corruption.

The project activities include 6 training sessions for 255 specialists from the Public Ministry and the Anti-Corruption General Directorate.

The training sessions on preventing and combating corruption and on exchanging good practices between teams of professionals (prosecutors, judicial police officers, prevention officers), which took place between 10 and 26 March 2025, included lectures on "Strengthening the capacity of law enforcement agencies to identify situations where organised crime groups benefit from the support of officials".

5.3.5 Analysis and, where appropriate, revision of the legislative framework governing the functioning of the DGA with a view to aligning it with general criminal policy requirements and adapting its operational capacity to the trends and dynamics of corruption

The Anti-Corruption General Directorate carried out an analysis of the legal framework governing its functioning, and on 31 December 2024 proposed to the highest hierarchical body (Ministry of Internal Affairs) that the Law on the organisation and functioning of the Anti-Corruption General Directorate be included in the Government's Legislative Programme and the Government's Annual Work Plan [ro.: PALG], both for 2025, with the PALG file being drawn up. The law was not adopted in 2025 and is still in the draft stage.
