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# PART 1. Introduction

Strategic planning and programming is the cornerstone of the **Commission’s performance management framework**. The [Commission’s strategic plan for 2025-2029](#) translates the [political priorities](#) set in the [Political Guidelines of President von der Leyen](#) into general objectives. This process ensures institutional coherence, enhances accountability, and aligns the actions of all Commission services with the strategic vision of the mandate.

Within this framework, each Commission service has developed a strategic outlook for 2025-2029 in [Management plan 2025](#). This outlook defines a set of multiannual objectives and indicators to measure progress towards their achievement. These will be used for planning and reporting on performance throughout the period.

The **2026 management plan** sets out what the European School of Administration (EuSA) intends to deliver this year to contribute to these multiannual objectives (part 2). It also describes how EuSA will contribute to the common objective of building a modern and sustainable public administration (part 3). The main outputs with their indicators and targets are presented in Annexes 1 and 2.

The chart below lists the operating context and the main stakeholders through which EuSA implements its mission.



The European School of Administration's (EuSA, the School) main **mission** is to strengthen the EU civil service by **providing EU staff and managers with engaging, high quality and innovative learning and development opportunities** which build knowledge and skills, foster an effective and sustainable leadership and working culture, and promote EU's purpose and values.

EU's public administration will need **new skills to be fit for the future** and be able to deliver on its objectives and priorities in a rapidly shifting geopolitical and institutional context. The fast evolution of AI offers enormous potential whilst also carrying with it significant risks, which EuSA will actively address and capitalize on with responsibility and foresight, both in its learning activities and ways of working. EuSA has embraced AI and integrated it into many of its workstreams, and it will continue to do so in 2026 in a variety of ways helping the School to continuously experiment, innovate, and modernise. These efforts are a direct follow-up to an interinstitutional workshop that the School organised at the end of 2025 to reinforce knowledge and expertise in evaluation techniques and to maximise impact and the use of artificial intelligence in all L&D activities. Following the end of the pandemic and the introduction of large-scale telework, hybrid work is now the norm in all institutions. Digitalisation has greatly facilitated the work and created previously unimaginable advantages in terms of learning, particularly as regards access to training. However, challenges persist.

This is why continued efforts and investments are required to **improve efficiency, pedagogical approaches and performance** to ensure future-readiness, and continuous efforts are needed to promote an effective and sustainable **leadership and working culture**, where there is room and motivation for creativity and innovation.

EuSA needs to have a **strategic long-term** vision and at the same time show **flexibility and agility** and integrate foresight and proactivity in its planning and programme design – especially in view of diminishing budgets for learning and development across EU institutions.

# PART 2. Delivering on the Commission’s priorities in 2026

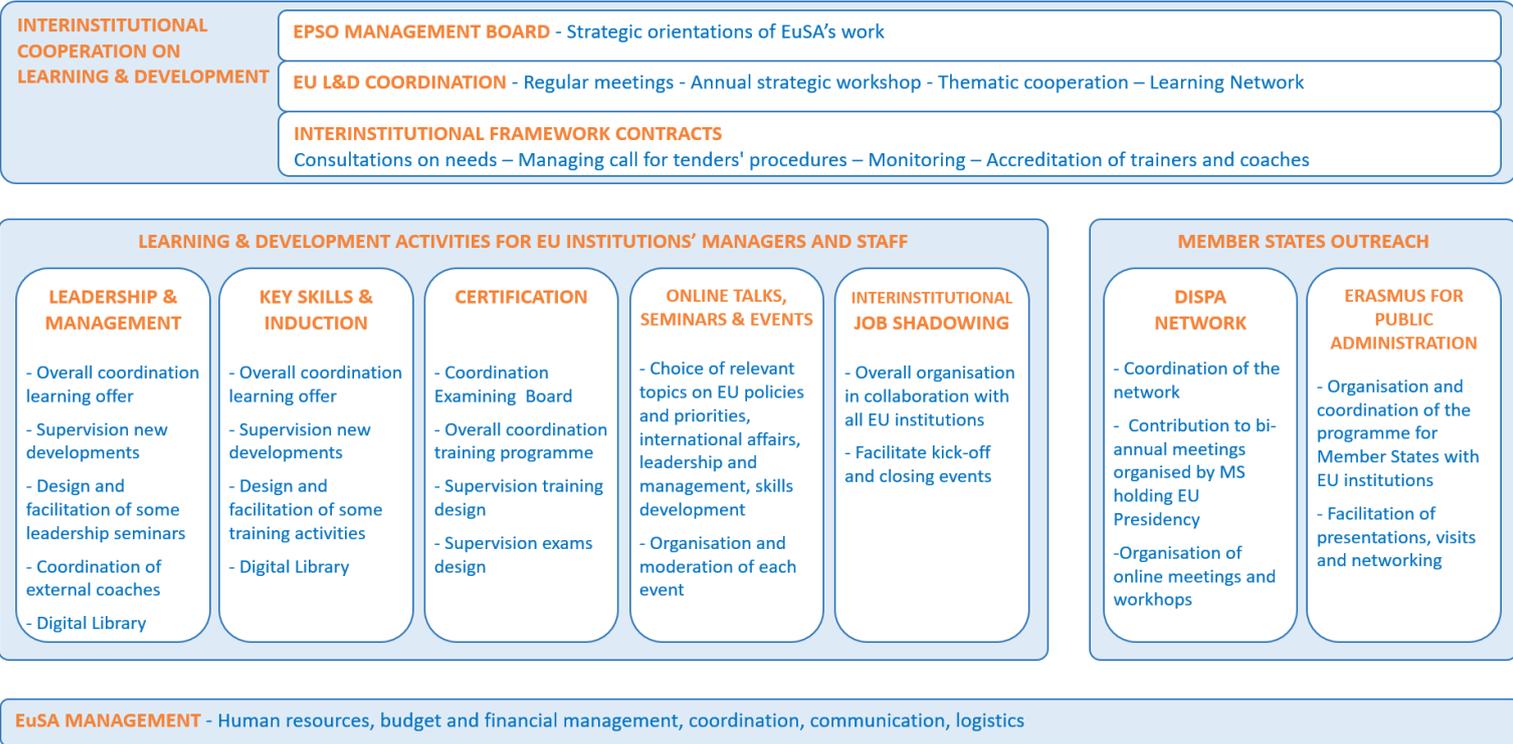
## EuSA’s operating model and stakeholders

EuSA works under the legal framework of the EU Treaties and serves all EU institutions through centralised budget implementation. Its **main stakeholders** are listed on page 3.

EuSA’s key areas of work remain anchored in 7 pillars: 5 internal and 2 external ones as shown below. Each pillar supports both short-term needs and longer-term priorities and transformation of the EU institutions, bodies and agencies.



### EuSA Activities Overview



**Specific Objective 1.1:** Improve leadership and management skills and behaviours in the EU institutions for greater effectiveness

EuSA will continue to innovate its learning portfolio to address emerging interinstitutional priorities and needs. Instead of continuously expanding the overall offer, new learning activities will strategically replace older formats, ensuring resource efficiency while addressing evolving needs and safeguarding a sustainable working environment for its staff and use of its budget.

Specific leadership activities for 2026 include:

- **Introduce a new course on Selection and recruitment for managers.** After consultation of all EU institutions, EuSA has designed a new course which will cover the full selection cycle – from anticipating vacancies and defining team needs to running effective interviews and supporting successful onboarding with particular attention given to managing unconscious bias and fostering diversity.
- **Organise two parallel programmes for Newly Appointed Directors (NAD)** to meet the increasing need in the EU institutions. By doing so, EuSA will be able to double the number of available places from 24 to 48 for senior managers having been appointed Directors in the previous year.
- Following the successful pilot in 2025, EuSA will **organise co-development sessions for new Directors** to further support new senior managers as they progress in their leadership roles. In addition, and to further support this group of senior managers, co-development sessions will be launched for the 2025 cohort of the programme *Newly Appointed Directors* and for all alumni since 2019. As additional support, coaching sessions will be made available to this target group for further development.
- **Continue to curate the digital library on leadership and management:** complementing the formal training course offer, micro-learning opportunities will be gathered into a pedagogically sound set of digital libraries accessible to all EU institutions: Toolkit for new Team Managers, Develop your Leadership, Resources for Senior Managers
- **Introduce collaborative communication** (also called non-violent communication) into the design of the two flagship programmes Lead your Team and Sustainable Leadership Journey.
- **Introduce the newly redesigned course Unconscious Bias in its new format** of half a day module (4 hours) in EuSA's permanent offer. The course has been piloted in 2025 and will cover essential insights into unconscious bias and its impact on managerial challenges: task allocation and growth opportunities, performance and feedback, conflict handling.
- Organise a workshop to test the design of a course on the basis of **EuSA's guiding leadership** principles which can serve as an overall compass for managers, combining a set of skills, practices, values and mindsets, *inter alia* with reference to articles 2 and 3 of the EU Treaty.
- **Start reflections, consultation and drafting of a new 'fit for the future' programme** of several modules focussing on foresight, scenario building, navigating complexity, artificial intelligence, and more.
- **Launch the interinstitutional needs consultation** for the next framework contract for leadership and coaching services.

**Specific Objective 1.2:** General skills of all staff are improved to promote efficiency in modern, high-performing and sustainable EU institutions

- In view of rapid developments, particularly, but not exclusively, in the area of artificial intelligence, EuSA will **explore new learning activities and suitable learning formats** to meet emerging needs. This approach also applies to diversity and inclusion, where the offer will be updated beyond established themes to reflect current organisational, institutional and societal realities.
- Following the successful closure of the **interinstitutional tender procedure for key skills, resilience and team events** (3 lots, including 1 previously managed by DG HR) EuSA will kick-off and introduce the new **framework contracts** on behalf of all participating authorities. Emphasis will be on ensuring business continuity, quality and smooth collaboration: establishing solid ties with the external contractors, sign Service Level Agreements with all participating EU institutions, bodies and agencies and organise accreditation sessions for all new trainers.
- **Launch of a newly designed and piloted course on Generative AI** with the aim of complementing the existing interinstitutional offer defining key GenAI concepts, identifying different types of AI tools, and verifying their outputs by applying critical thinking in the EU professional context.
- **Design and introduce a course on collaborative communication** (also referred to as non-violent communication) for all staff and managers (designed and facilitated by internal staff)
- **Mainstream aspects of diversity and inclusion and artificial intelligence** throughout all of EuSA's Key Skills courses.
- **Redesign** of the following courses:
  - o Day-to-Day negotiation
  - o Resilient mind
  - o Developing your resilience
  - o Climate Leadership

**Specific Objective 1.3:** Staff's understanding of the working environment of the EU institutions, the raison d'être of the European project is improved, and better interinstitutional cooperation is fostered

Following intense interinstitutional consultation and a successful pilot end 2025, EuSA will start running in 2026 its **new interinstitutional induction programme** for all newcomers including contract agents, temporary agents and officials. The programme complements and, in some cases, replaces, internal newcomers sessions in individual institutions. It will focus on the EU functioning and interconnections, values, history and aim at instilling a common sense of belonging to the EU civil service.

**Specific Objective 1.4:** The role of the European School of Administration as a hub for cooperation between EU institutions and with Member States is reinforced.

### Interinstitutional job shadowing

- Prepare and launch the **fourth edition** of the interinstitutional job shadowing for an enlarged audience, including **five** new institutions, agencies and bodies: the European Parliament (piloting the programme with DG EXPO), the European Environment Agency (EEA), The Innovative Health Initiative (IHI-JU), European Medicines Agency (EMA), The European Security and Markets Authority (ESMA).
- Continue efforts to enlarge the **number of participating institutions**.

### Coordination of the DISPA Network

- **Ensure successful bilateral cooperation** with the national public schools of administration in upcoming Presidency countries Cyprus and in Ireland to prepare the **DISPA conferences of 2026**.
- **Reinforce capacity-building** in Member States through the DISPA network by regular online meetings as well as by inviting the DISPA members to attend online talks organised by EuSA on topics of common and particular interest for the Member States.
- **Collaborate with the Regional School of Public Administration (ReSPA)**, extending support for capacity building in the field of learning and development for candidate countries and strengthen overall cooperation, particularly following the DISPA meeting in Montenegro in 2025 on the topic of 'Future proofing the public service'.

### Erasmus for Public Administration for young governmental officials in the Member states

- **Replace the previous two-week physical visit to Brussels with a hybrid blended format** (one week online in combination with one week on site in Brussels) to cut costs and enhance efficiency and synergies of the programme following consecutive years of budget cuts. Special focus will be on ensuring business continuity in this new format, a high-quality learning experience and effective networking for the participants.
- Initiate a request process for the **transfer of budget** for the Erasmus exchange for governmental officials from DG HR to EuSA in order to increase both control of the spending and flexibility in the use of the budget for this programme.

### Thematic seminars, events and online talks

**EuSA will continue to organise thematic seminars and online talks** tailored to emerging institutional needs. In 2026, special attention will be given to artificial intelligence and new technologies, awareness raising of the EU institutions, scientific research, leadership, innovation in public administration, as well as topics reflecting inter-institutional, national and international contexts — especially around national elections in the Member States.

In addition, a series of online talks will be organised focusing on key skills, such as resilience, decision-making, personal effectiveness, work-life balance, etc.

**Specific Objective 1.5:** A high-quality Certification training programme is provided to the institutions to help them develop the talents of assistant grade staff with the potential to become administrators

The **Certification procedure** continues to evolve towards greater cost-efficiency, simplification and compatibility with realities of the institutions, both in terms of content and budget.

Following the decision taken by EPSO Management Board in 2025, EuSA will:

- **Align the competencies** in the Certification programme with **EPSO Competency Framework** and adapt both training and exams accordingly.
- **Reduce the number of compulsory training days** from 21 to 15 days.
- **Design new training modules** integrating non-compulsory modules before and after the programme, coaching and a more individually tailored approach to learning.
- **Simplify** the organisation of the exams.
- **Adapt the training accordingly** for all stakeholders, including candidates, Examining Board and trainers.
- **Ensure clear communication of the changes at all times with all relevant stakeholders** and continuously gather feedback and questions to feed into the new developments.
- **Prepare an in-depth evaluation** of the Certification pilot project in order to capitalize on lessons learnt for next editions.
- **Exchange regularly with institutions** in the context of the interinstitutional network for L&D to make sure institutions needs are met.

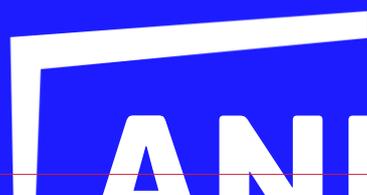

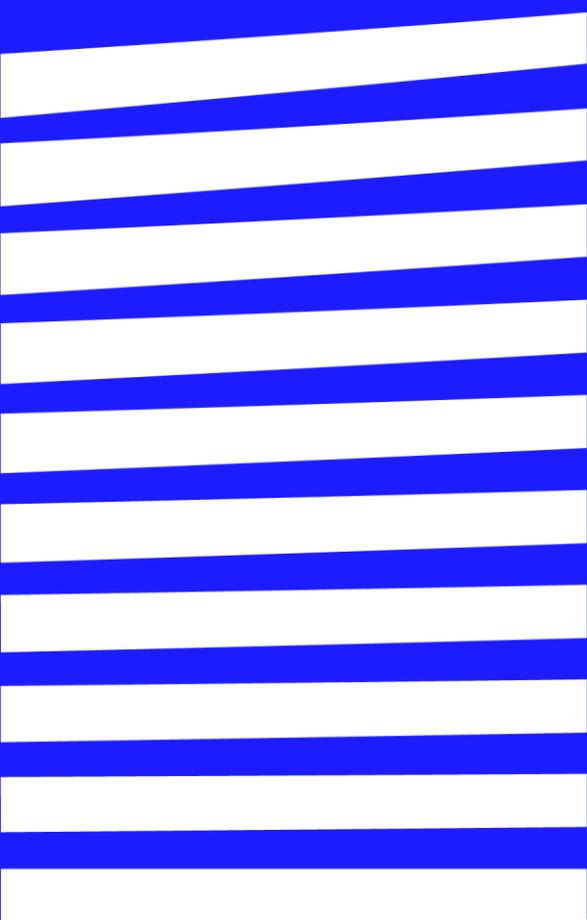
