Dear friends,

the situation concerning the judges' salaries in Slovenia is problematic.

First of June 2023 Slovenian Constitutional Court released the following judgement:

Since the Government did nothing to execute the judgement, the Judicial Council of Slovenia sent the following letter to the President of the European Council:

The position of Slovenian Government was and still is that the judges salaries should be regulated when the negotiations with unions of the public sector finishes, so the whole system of the public sector salaries would be regulated.

In year 2023 the Consultative group of Slovenian judges try to talk to the government to gain some progress, but nothing has been done. Than with the big flooding in the beginning of August everything stops.

The judgement of the Constitutional Court should be executed by Slovenian Parliament in 6 month: deadline 3. 1. 2024. Nothing happened so the Slovenian Judges' Association started the activities:

on 4Th of January we had a one hour protests on the seat of the courts: the hearings were interrupted and the following statement was excepted:

From 10Th of January till 24Th of January judges work and have hearings only in urgent cases all other hearings were cancelled.

Yesterday The Judicial Council decided to go to the Constitutional Court again asking the Court to decide on how their decision of 1. 6. 2023 should be executed and to order the Parliament to do so....

All in all the atmosphere among judges is not good and it is difficult to work.

I will keep you informed on further developments.
